- Families will be responsible to check that all items are returned upon camper checkout.

### **FOR ALL SESSIONS OF CAMP – Including Horseback Riding**

#### **WHAT NOT TO PACK**

Cell Phones, iPods, Gameboys, personal gaming devices, or any other electronics; food for the cabin, sports & rec equipment, expensive jewelry, designer clothes, sentimental belongings or items of value. The Fowler Center is not responsible for lost or damaged items. Items will be confiscated and returned at the end of camp. For more information on prohibited items, please see the Camp Handbook 2025.

**Possession of the following items will be grounds for immediate dismissal from camp:** Alcohol, drugs, lighters, weapons (including pocket knives), or pets. Note: because our desire is to provide a safe environment for every camper, we reserve the right to search the luggage and/or belongings of individual campers.

#### **Cabin Accommodations**

Main Cabins sleep a max of 12 campers and 4 staff. Ranch Cabins sleep up to 9 campers and 3 staff. Each camper has a single bed with cubby for belongings. Toilets and showers located in cabin. Cabins equipped with heat/air.

#### **Platform Tent Accommodations (Outpost)**

Platform Tents sleep 3 campers and 1 staff. Each camper has a single bed. Porta Johns located at campsite. Showers utilized at main camp or ranch cabins.
